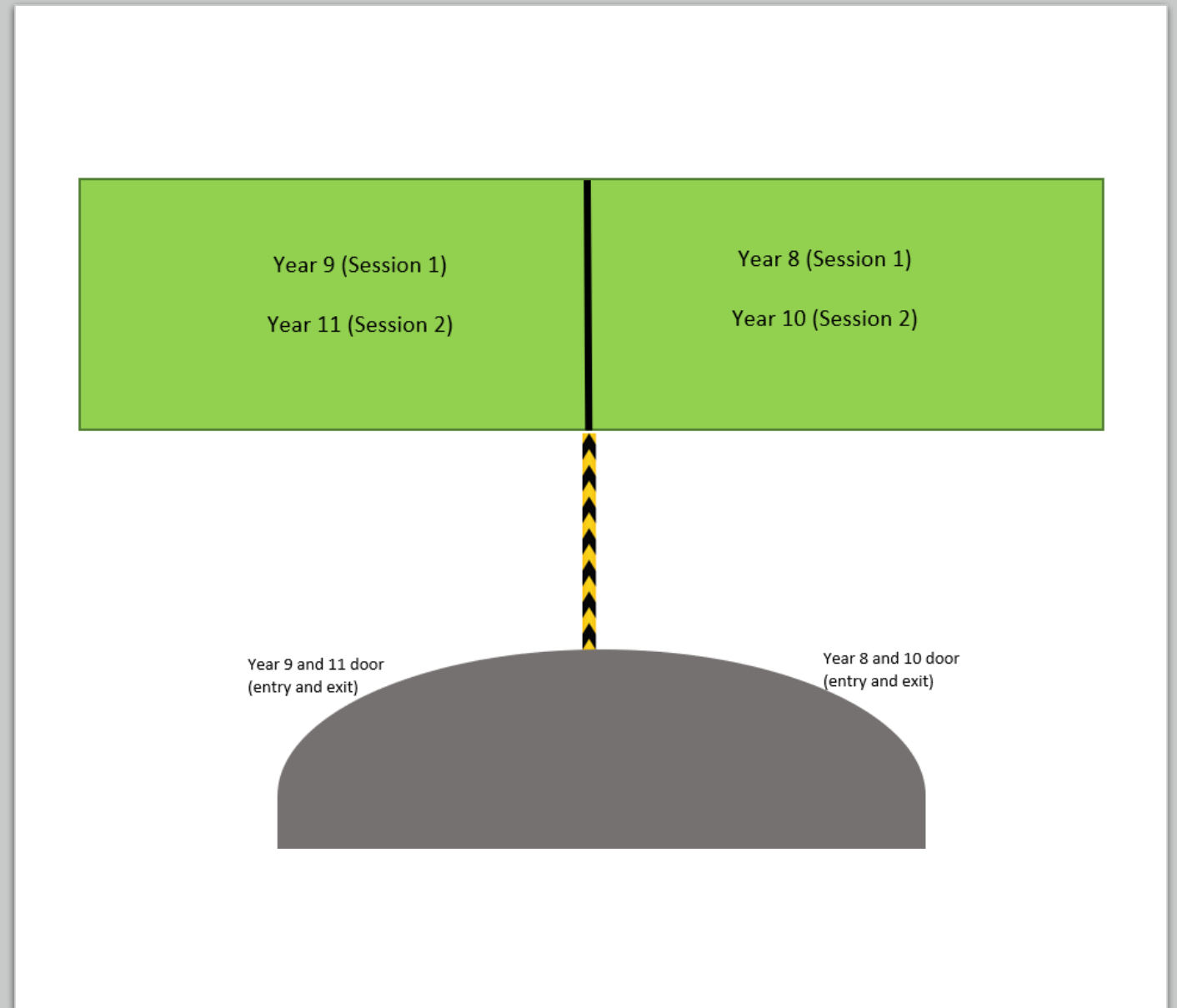
# *Indoor Social Zones*

Food will be served at break times from within each indoor zone

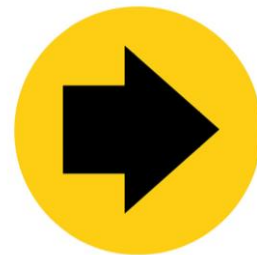
# Outdoor Social Zones

- Mrs Carey has talked to you about additions to our Ladder of Consequence and Mrs Timmins has spoken to you about changes to expectations in classrooms during your lessons.
- It is important that everybody ***understands*** and ***follows*** all the new rules which are here to keep us all ***safe***.
- We all have lots of work to do from September making sure that none of our students have been disadvantaged by the Coronavirus pandemic. # Wash Your Hands Frequently!

## Why?

Hand washing is more effective than  
hand sanitiser

**BUT**

you should use hand sanitiser when  
you are unable to wash your hands

- ✓ Washing hands prevents illnesses and spread of infections to others.
- ✓ Handwashing with soap removes germs from hands. Soap breaks down the oils on your skin, water rinses these broken down chemicals away and the microbes go along for the ride.
- ✓ This helps prevent infections because:
  - People frequently touch their eyes, nose, and mouth without even realising it.
  - Germs can get into the body through the eyes, nose and mouth, causing infection.
  - Germs from unwashed hands can get into foods and drinks while people prepare or consume them.
  - Germs from unwashed hands can be transferred to other objects, like handrails or table tops and then transferred to another person's hands.
  - Removing germs through handwashing therefore helps prevent the spread and contraction of infectious disease.
