


Sixth Form Results

We are delighted to congratulate our Sixth Form Students today on their fantastic exam success. Despite the national challenges of this year's grading process, we are pleased and proud to see that our students' hard work, ambition and commitment to their studies has been rewarded with a great number of positive highlights, including 25% of all A level grades as A*/A and 52% of all grades being A*- B grade.

All of our Sixth Form students have been successful in progressing onto approved destinations of their choice, with 67% securing places at University/Higher Education/Training Apprenticeships and the remainder moving to employment opportunities as elected by the students.

Furthermore, we are incredibly proud to announce the first student in The Academy's history, obtaining a place at Oxford University, to study Chemistry, having secured A*A* A* at A level in Chemistry, Maths and History.
